**Make reservations early! All convenient hotels that will take dogs will be full for this dog show!**

**Host Hotel: The Marriott Residence Inn** 1701 South University Drive Fort Worth, TX 76107 1 817-870-1011. The Hotel is about 1 mile from the show site. All rooms are suites. The studio suites all have a sleeping area, a full kitchen and a dining /sitting area. The sofa pulls out for an extra sleeping area. A few suites are available that have two bedrooms and two bathrooms. A complimentary full breakfast is available each morning. The Floater rate is 129.00/night for the studio suite and there is a one time deposit of 100.00/room for dogs. The hotel is adjacent to the Trinity River Trails (which stretch for 35 miles) and makes exercising your Airedales easy and enjoyable! ### Driving Directions

From Dallas Ft Worth International Airport to the Host Hotel: Take the South Exit From the Airport to 183 W to 820 S to 30 W. Exit University Drive. South 1/2 mile, hotel is on the left.

From the DFW Airport to the Show Site: Take the South Exit from the Airport to 183 W to 820 S to 30 W. Exit University Drive. Go north 1/2 mile to the red light at Harley St. Go Left (West) and the show site is on your right. Turn right onto Burnett Tandy Drive and immediately turn right into the "unloading" area. Airedale Alley will be in the 'SWINE BARN': the first building.

From the Show Site to the Host Hotel: GO East on Harley Ave. Turn Right (South) on University. The Marriott Residence Inn is about 1 mile south on the left Side of University.

### Grooming Space Reservations

Grooming Space (Airedale Alley) will be in the Swine Barn. This barn has a concrete floor and each space is approximately 8 Ft square, separated by 3 Ft high chain link fencing. Let us know how much space you will need and it will be held for your arrival. (make reservations on page 8) There is no cost for the reservation, but we cannot hold space if we don't know you are coming!

If you are flying dogs to the show and need a grooming table or extra crate (One for your hotel room and one for the set up) let us know and we will arrange for you to borrow one from a local Airedaler (make reservations on page 8)

## Optional 'Honky Tonk' Night in Texas

Friday, March 25th at the Ft Worth Historical District Stockyards

Between 1866 and 1890, more than four million head of cattle were trailed through Fort Worth. For the drovers heading Longhorn Cattle up the Chisholm trail to the railheads, Fort Worth was the last major stop for rest and supplies; beyond Fort Worth they would have to deal with crossing the Red River into Indian Territory. As a result, it was soon known as "Cowtown" and had its own disreputable entertainment district that was known all over the West as "Hell's Half Acre". The railroads finally arrived in 1876 and Fort Worth became a major shipping point for livestock. This prompted plans in 1887 for the construction of the Union Stockyards. Construction of local packing plants began in 1902. Today, the historic area offers a relaxed contact with that history.

This "Honky Tonk" event is offered 'a la carte' so that individuals and small groups can design the evening to fit themselves: The Ft Worth Historical District is about 20-30 minutes from the Show Site/Host Hotel. Once you are in the district, all the attractions are within a comfortable strolling area.

**Sites to See** \* Longhorn cattle drive at 4PM \* Texas Cowboy Hall of Fame (open 11AM to 5PM) \* Stock Yards Museum (open 10AM to 5PM) \* Texas Trail of Fame \* Stockyards Hotel, first opened in 1907 \* **Don't miss** Legendary **White Elephant Saloon** for a tall cold draft and some 'boot scootin'. They have live music every night and trace their history to a famous gun fight in 1887.
